### Current Status from the Chairman

#### Wilton Park Update

Following extensive discussions with Inland Homes, helped by the large volume of responses from Parents to their initial Planning Application that made no provision for interim pitches, we have agreed a plan that guarantees the future of the club. So thank you all for your help!

This plan is as follows:

- We will continue on our current pitches for the 2018/9 season
- We will move to new interim pitches, further east on the site (behind the current security fence), during the building phase of c. 5 years
- The final site will have new pitches constructed further east from our current pitches (ie towards Beaconsfield)

Inland Homes are yet to re-submit their Planning Application, but in the meantime we are grateful for their collaboration.

## OUR THIRD FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT



We held our third football tournament in the new Arbour Park stadium over 3 days from Saturday May 26<sup>th</sup> to Monday 28<sup>th</sup> May. We had 142 teams taking part and we successfully hosted 3000 people over the three days from the U7 to U13 age group.

The Under 11's moved up to 9-a-side this season with slightly bigger goals, a bigger pitch and the introduction of offside. With 45 players registered, we entered 3 teams in the league in the first, third and sixth divisions.

As ever, the boys and girls have been a pleasure to coach and their enthusiasm and spirit have been fantastic.

The U11 Lions started the season with great expectations with many of the boys having been playing together for 4 or more years. However, we did not adapt to the 9 a-side format quite as easily as we had hoped and struggled to get much momentum to our season. In an extremely competitive league, we were too often of the wrong end of a one goal defeat when our play seemed to deserve better. But there were several highlights including a 4-0 thrashing of local rivals Flackwell and a 3-3 draw with Cookham, consistently one of the best teams in the league, missing out on a famous victory only in the final 30 seconds. But what was most pleasing during the season was the commitment and tenacity the group showed, never giving up and never letting their heads drop. Very admirable qualities for 11 year old kids. Well done to them all!

The U11 Tigers began the season well with 3 victories and a draw in the first 4 matches, and the signs looked good. A 3-0 win over Penn & Tyler's Green was a highpoint, which we could not live up to again! As the season progressed we began to suffer unexpected defeats, and the main cause of this seemed to be a lack of consistency in our matchday 11. A move to a 3-1-3-1 formation allowed us to tighten up at the back, and our form picked up once again. I think our season can be summed up as "comfortably mid-table".

### *U12 Holger Beyer, Kerry Overman*

Most of the boys made the transition to secondary schools at the start of the season, which came with its challenges. Quite a few took to Saturday morning mudwrestling. Allegedly there was a ball hidden in the carnage, but you couldn't see it because nobody ever kicked it – it is the wrong shape. We could no longer all train together regularly and the coaching team struggled to apply its revolutionary training methods and spectacular cone displays to full effect. We also reduced the age group from 3 teams to 2, which also meant that many of the boys played a few leagues higher than last year as the result of a gravity defying trickle-up effect. The yellow team found it tough at the beginning and we needed to dig deep and show some real character. Most importantly, the boys needed to gel again as a team and build a very strong team spirit to see them through the early part of the season. The U13FC team played in Division 2 of the Wycombe & South Bucks League this season, moving to 11-a-side for the first time, and acquitted themselves with distinction against some now familiar rivals.

They were in with a chance of promotion to the top division right up to the final weekend of matches and, whilst they narrowly missed out, the boys should be extremely proud of their efforts!

Often up against much bigger teams, their play was characterised by real commitment in the tackle, disciplined defending and pace up front. Scoring 51 goals in their 16 league games (and conceding only 34, the division's second lowest total), a feature of their play was their teamwork: 14 of the 16 outfield players scored goals.

In the summer tournaments, the boys have acquitted themselves well, taking a number of first division scalps and narrowly missing out on a place in the final of the Marlow tournament.

They remain a polite, friendly and positive group who are a pleasure to coach.

U13 Colts The transition from 9 a side to 11 a side on bigger pitches was a tough lesson from the beginning.

On top of that our early fixtures in Division 5 were against some exceptionally good sides including a cup match against Chalfont Saints which was a very substantial defeat (13-0).

Those incredibly tough games at the start of the season, whilst hard to take, were a steep learning curve that ultimately the boys progressed from.

By the start of November, a few months into the season, we were rock bottom of the table and was looking like it would be a very long season ahead but they all pulled together and slowly began to get results. One win was all we needed and then they made it a good habit going on a 7 match unbeaten run in the league. By the beginning of March we had moved into 4th place and we found ourselves with a double header against the team in 3rd, away vs Risborough.

The boys were excellent and came away from those games with a win and a draw which put them into 3rd place and closing the gap quickly on 2nd placed Downley Dynamos.

We now had no choice but to beat Downley twice in the double header to have any chance of 2nd.

Two great games were played and the boys were exceptional winning the first 4-2 and then drawing the 2nd game 1-1.

So in the end it was a 3rd place finish for us which was a fantastic achievement from where we started back in November.

This group needs to just believe in themselves and their abilities a little bit more and I'm sure good things WILL happen for them in the coming season.

Looking forward to the U14s already. Sadly we are losing a few players to new school etc but we have some new players coming in as well so bring on the 18-19 season.

As the 2017/2018 season began the U18's moved up into the heady heights of Division 3. After an initial 'beating' they steadied their nerves and got down to business. Wins were coming. Draws more common. Loses not unknown. The lads played some excellent games of football, often beating top teams in our division. Yet as the true 'lovers of the game' rather than 'professional footballers' we are, we too often allowed our performance to slip which damaged us in the final positions (leaving us somewhere in the middle of the table -final position to be decided at the time of writing this). It should also be noted the lads did well in their cup performances, only being knocked out by the team at the top of Division 1 in the semi-final of the Turnball cup.

Most rewarding, for me at least, was that once again I watched the performances from all the players improving, both as individuals and as a team, as the season progressed. There was real commitment and effort from the team. Getting our proper Goalkeeper three or four games into the season made a big difference, our defence became more solid, the mid field more flexible and dynamic and the forwards more dangerous. Passing and team co-ordination became more fluid and skillful.
